One Flow One Brent (OFOB)

Until very recently, there have been too few opportunities available to young people to be heard, influence or develop solutions related to violence and how it affects young people living on three estates, Chalkhill, Stonebridge and Church End. With the support of the Young Brent Foundation, housing providers, the local authority and the VRU, young people will be able to influence neighbourhood planning and services and the wider youth and community offer for Brent.

Working with a range of different partners who are motivated to work together towards a common goal will enable young people to use a collective voice to address the structural change needed to tackle the drivers of violence.

Organisations should be able to demonstrate that they are currently able to engage children and young people from Chalkhill, Church End and Stonebridge.

Eligibility

Organisations must be members of YBF legally constituted and have a bank account

Benefit children and young people in in the target areas aged 10-25

Co-produce and design activities with children and young people

Process

Applications will be accepted from 3rd
September 2022 - 17th
October 20022
Work on projects must begin by March 2023.
Funding is for 12 months

Selection criteria

Benefit diverse groups of young people

Provide, training, education, advice to better understand drivers of violence

Requirements

Apply for grants up to a maximum of £15,000 (most grants will be for £10,000 and under) £15,000 for partnership working

Organisations are expected to participate in OFOB operational steering groups

Projects which focus on young women's experience of violence. Providing youth voice opportunities

2

Projects which support transition from primary to secondary school. In particular, healthy relationships and developing agency

3

Projects which support designing out crime in the target areas

This could include consultations, events or campaigns

Your project will need to demonstrate how it can achieve one or both of these outcomes

Develops inclusive decision making with young people and communities

Builds stronger community networks.
